### **Performance and Production Metrics Review Workgroup Meeting**

### June 5, 2020, 9:00 AM

### **Meeting Minutes**

- Florida Transportation Commission (FTC) Executive Director Ralph Yoder opened the meeting.
  - Meeting minutes for 5/27 should be out by next week
  - The survey results from the 5/27 meeting were shared
- Executive Director Yoder reminded the group of Governor Ron DeSantis's Transportation Priorities: Improve Safety, Embrace Innovation and Technology, and Reduce Congestion.
- Executive Director Yoder also reminded the group of the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Mission, Vision, and Vital Few as they begin the brainstorming session.
- Metrics should be congruent and supportive of FDOT's mission and the governor's transportation priorities.

## **Area for Performance Evaluation: Preservation**

- Ralph Yoder, Executive Director, Florida Transportation Commission
  - The department is required by statute to fund preservation before capacity
- Edward "Eddy" Gonzalez, Vice President, RS&H
  - Bridges that have posted weight restrictions
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - Bridge weight requirements can be deleted since that is put into the design structure, and there is a national standard
  - May want to keep the metric regarding maintaining bridges
    - Have a condition rating of excellent or good
- Edward "Eddy" Gonzalez, Vice President, RS&H
  - Bridge weight requirements should be nestled into the condition rating, and is therefore, not necessary
  - Should the percent of bridges being replaced vs the percent planned be a secondary measure?
    - Seems to be more of a production item
- Stacy Miller, Assistant Secretary of Finance and Administration, Florida Department of Transportation
  - % of executed bridge replacement projects compared to the % of projects planned is incorporated in a production measure, along with meeting your letting plan
- Ananth Prasad, President, Florida Transportation Builders Association
  - o The secondary measures should be deleted all together for production
    - Most seem to be a department measure, and not something FTC should be measuring
  - Agrees that the weight restriction can be dropped
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - The departments roadway goals are:
    - Safe roadway designs

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- Meet design plans
- Maintaining all features so it is in full working performance
- Maintaining all facilities
- Maintaining bridges to ensure they work as attended
- Ralph Yoder, Executive Director, Florida Transportation Commission
  - o What would be an effective measurement for pavement condition?
- Edward "Eddy" Gonzalez, Vice President, RS&H
  - o Currently required to have a pavement condition rating of excellent or good
    - At least 80%
  - Should the 80% requirement be increased?
    - More funding would be needed if it is increased
- Dr. Robert Bertini, Executive Director, Center for Urban Transportation Research
  - O Asset management- What are the returns you get for investing in the assets?
  - Asset management is included in FDOT day to day operations
  - o It seems like the relation to the user (user experience) is missing from the metric
    - Ride quality
- Ananth Prasad, President, Florida Transportation Builders Association
  - o The 80% should not be raised
  - o FDOT does a good job maintaining
  - The department internally needs to ensure that the 80% is maintained throughout the districts
    - One may have 70%, while another has 90%
- Edward "Eddy" Gonzalez, Vice President, RS&H
  - o Ride, rut, and cracking- if it falls below a certain threshold, it triggers resurfacing
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - Resurfacing program is still in place
  - If the department does fall below 80%, it costs a significant amount of money to return to 80%
  - Monitor to make sure one district is not falling below another
    - Also is a performance standard for district secretaries
- Stacy Miller, Assistant Secretary of Finance and Administration, Florida Department of Transportation
  - One of the largest programs is resurfacing
    - Preservation of the state highway system
  - o Ride is normally done as a secondary measure because of the contributing factors
    - Depends on where you are in the state, how many utility manholes covers you have, features you have on the roadway, etc.
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - o Return on investment
  - 80% provides value to the customer
  - o Most customers will not see the extra 10 or 20%
- David Genson, Commissioner, District One, Florida Transportation Commission

- The preservation metrics are all very broad
- o Currently, there is no differentiation between the interstate and non-interstate
- Should it be higher in metropolitan areas since the interstate is the primary form of transportation there?
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - The interstate performs much better than local roads since you do not have utility concerns
  - Would a separate measure bring value?
  - o Introducing new measures within the department regarding surface ride
- Ralph Yoder, Executive Director, Florida Transportation Commission
  - o Look at data to evaluate historic performance on the interstate vs. local roads
- David Genson, Commissioner, District One, Florida Transportation Commission
  - o In looking at other states, many do break it down by interstate vs. local roads
  - Also, with every roadway facility comes the stormwater management system
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - o Mobility as a metric needs to be enhanced
  - Stormwater management goes into the maintenance program
  - An asset management contractor is responsible for maintaining and monitoring drainage structures as part of the asset maintenance contract
    - They are held to a performance metric
- Stacy Miller, Assistant Secretary of Finance and Administration, Florida Department of Transportation
  - NPDES- Will do an analysis of the existing drainage system
    - Monitoring outfall
    - Ensuring that they are meeting clean water standards
    - Also have separate drainage projects as well
- David Genson, Commissioner, District One, Florida Transportation Commission
  - Need for environmental metrics
- Jason Montgomery, Director of Business Intelligence, Jacksonville Transportation Authority
  - Condition ratings seem to be more from an engineering perspective and not from a user perspective
    - Customer satisfaction survey?
- Stacy Miller, Assistant Secretary of Finance and Administration, Florida Department of Transportation
  - The department does do surveys for road users
    - Either annually or bi-annually
    - Many people do not differentiate between state and local roads

## **Area for Performance Evaluation: Production**

- Edward "Eddy" Gonzalez, Vice President, RS&H
  - Consultant contract dollars
    - When you come in low, it seems to appear as a negative thing
  - o The number of contracts executed should be a primary measure

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- There are a lot of factors that drive what the estimate may be
  - As (project) scope becomes more finalized, things can change
  - Should 5% be viewed as negative?
- Ananth Prasad, President, Florida Transportation Builders Association
  - Do not want to over budget when preparing estimates
    - Needs to be as correct as possible
    - Do not want to be too high or too low
  - Accountability needs to be across all aspects of the project
  - Look at the production manual
    - Are we measuring too much?
- Stacy Miller, Assistant Secretary of Finance and Administration, Florida Department of Transportation
  - You want to be within a tighter range
    - If you overestimate, you are not using the most of your resources
    - Want to appropriately utilize every dollar of allocated
    - Overestimating leaves money on the table that you cannot redirect fast enough for the public to feel the benefit
    - There should be a balance between production and operations
- Edward "Eddy" Gonzalez, Vice President, RS&H
  - There are things that happen in design and construction that can affect the project
    - Accountability needs to be spread among these areas
    - How accurate was the estimate provided?
  - Should right of way continue to be measured?
- David Genson, Commissioner, District One, Florida Transportation Commission
  - Development and delivery
    - Are they on time and on budget?
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - Some of the measures are way too detailed
  - o Did you produce the number at the value you said you would?
    - Let the department measure everything else rolled into that
- Dr. Robert Bertini, Executive Director, Center for Urban Transportation Research
  - Now it is more about collaboration, not building like 50 years ago
  - Can a measure for collaboration be added somehow?
  - 50 years ago, they were not using Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSM&O) strategies

### **Area for Performance Evaluation: Capacity Improvement**

- David Genson, Commissioner, District One, Florida Transportation, Commission
  - Should look back at the Sourcebook
- Dr. Robert Bertini, Executive Director, Center for Urban Transportation Research
  - o Capacity was important back in 1950 but does not translate to users
  - Think about mobility and accessibility, along with reliability
    - Do people have access to the system?
    - Are demands being satisfied?

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- How resilient is the system?
- Edward "Eddy" Gonzalez, Vice President, RS&H
  - o Do we need to differentiate between state and local roads?
  - o Ridership compared to population growth
    - Is that still a measure we need to have?
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - o Must consider all modes and the volume of customers
- Ralph Yoder, Executive Director, Florida Transportation Commission
  - Statute gives the FTC flexibility
  - o Is there a way to utilize technology to help develop this measure?
  - o Time it takes to clear an incident.
- Courtney Drummond, Assistant Secretary of Engineering Operations, Florida Department of Transportation
  - Needs to be a measure that rolls under safety
