

FDOT Small Business by the Numbers



When looking at number of contracts and total value of contracts:

- ▶ Small Businesses comprise 74% of FDOT prequalified firms, but were awarded less than 20% of FDOT Contracts
- Small Businesses received only 11.5% of the FDOT Dollars awarded
- Small Businesses received an average of less than \$550K in Prime contract awards per firm, while Non-Small Businesses received over \$12 million per firm, which is 22 times more per firm than Small Businesses

FDOT Small Businesses and Florida Employment







When looking at employment of Florida residents:

- ▶ Florida Residents comprise over 94% of the staff at FDOT Prequalified Small Businesses, while the staff of Non-Small Businesses consist of approximately 7% Florida Residents
- ▶ Based on total contract value awarded, Small Businesses received \$51,200 per Florida employee over the past 5 years compared to \$115,380 per Florida employee for Non-Small Businesses.
- Small Businesses received 44 cents per Florida Employee for every one dollar received by Non-Small Businesses.
- The discrepancy in dollars to Small Businesses has a direct negative impact on small businesses' ability to maintain employment of Florida Residents.
- Contract dollars to non-Florida businesses results in significant loss of tax revenue to the State of Florida
